

Ponderings from the Pastor's Pen

A couple of weeks ago, I traveled a route that took me to fifteen of the waterfalls throughout northern Wisconsin. The fall leaves were still quite brilliant then and the cool, crisp air was refreshing, but the waterfalls were truly majestic! Time after time, I'd search out a rocky ledge near the falls where I could sit and just listen to the roar and splashing of the water for several moments.

It reminded me of an insight I had earlier this year when I spent a few days of personal retreat with the Benedictine sisters at Holy Wisdom Monastery in Madison, WI. During evening prayer one night, I was struck by a line from the scripture reading which described the voice of God as being like the sound of "many waters". Later, during supper I mentioned to the sister who had read that verse how intriguing that was to me as someone who has always been drawn to the sight and sound of water. She remarked that, yes, water can be a

quiet soothing sound, or it can pound like waves.

I searched my Bible for verses that describe God's voice like water and I found several:

- Ezekiel 43:2 "Suddenly the glory of the God of Israel appeared from the east. The sound of his coming was like the roar of rushing waters, and the whole landscape shone with his glory."
- Revelation 1:15 "his voice thundered like mighty ocean waves."
- Revelation 14:2 "And I heard a sound from heaven like the roar of mighty ocean waves or the roaring of

loud thunder. It was like the sound of many harpists playing together."

• Revelation 19:6 – "Then I heard again what sounded like the shout of a vast crowd or the roar of the mighty ocean waves or the crash of loud thunder." I love the idea that God's voice sounds like water—mighty, lyrical, unstoppable. Perhaps that's why humans enjoy "white noise" like rainfall or waterfalls or crashing waves; it's soothing just like a sound-track of an ultrasound heartbeat is soothing to a newborn. It is the familiar sound of the one who gave us life!

As we turn the calendar page to the month of November, the God who gives us life is still leading us forward—ever closer to God. Even as the landscape around us grows dormant and the birdsongs grow quiet for a season, may we listen deeply for God and respond with thankful praise. I wish you a happy thanksgiving and I look forward to seeing you soon as we worship and serve God together.

You'll find in this newsletter a copy of the 2025 Pledge Sheet. We invite you to prayerfully consider the ways in which you can support and serve God's work in and through the Menomonie United Methodist Church in the year ahead and **return your pledge sheet on or before Consecration Sunday on November 17**. This is helpful to our Accountable Leadership Board as we plan for 2025 and it can be helpful to *you* because each of us as disciples are called to think and pray about how we can seek and serve God faithfully in the coming year.

Even if you aren't in a position to give financially at this time, please fill out the lower portion of the pledge sheet and commit to one or more ways you can give your time. Stewardship is about using *all* our resources well and the lower portion of the pledge sheet allows you to prayerfully commit to the ways you can serve God with your time, energy, and abilities in the coming year.

For the financial portion of this sheet, you'll notice you have the option of designating your gift. You may designate portions of your gift to any of these categories.

Many people designate their entire pledge to the General Fund as this is where the greatest need is. Money given to this fund covers all the operating expenses of our church—everything from curriculum and Bibles to the light bill, office supplies, and staff salaries.

You can also direct your gift to the Shared Offering. This is the money that goes to support United Methodist ministries throughout our state and around the world. This money helps fund new church starts (like the Grace Bridge Korean UMC right here in our building), congregational revitalization (through programs like MCCI-Missional Church Consultation Initiative), and health and welfare ministries within the Wisconsin Conference as well as missionary work all around the world. Our church's Shared Offering commitment is roughly \$140 per member.

Capital Improvement is another category to which several people pledge money each year. Our Trustees strive to maintain a robust Capital Improvement fund to cover the costs of major repairs or improvements to our building and grounds.

If you are especially passionate about giving to another

area of ministry, you can designate that in the Other category. Typically this might be to the Advance Specials missionaries or mission projects, or it could be for local ministries like Monday's Meal or Stepping Stones.


We especially want to encourage you to complete the pledge sheet if you never have before. Any amount you choose to give is greatly appreciated and will help our Accountable Leadership Board in their planning. We recommend tithing (giving 10% of one's income) because we have personally experienced how God provides in amazing ways when we are faithful in this biblical practice, but if that seems too daunting at this time just start with whatever amount seems feasible and work your way up from there. You can always adjust your pledge at any time as your financial circumstances change.

Extra envelopes and pledge sheets will be available on the table near the sanctuary entrance for your convenience.

We deeply appreciate *all* of the ways you support, serve, and grow here at the Menomonie United Methodist Church. It is exciting to see all that God is doing in and among us!




