

Ponderings from the Pastor's Pen

The words of the hymn "This Is a Day of New Beginnings" came to mind as I was praying this morning:

This is a day of new beginnings, time to remember and move on. time to believe what love is bringing. laying to rest the pain that's gone. For by the life and death of Jesus, God's mighty Spirit, now as then, can make for us a world of difference, as faith and hope are born again. Then let us, with the Spirit's daring, step from the past and leave behind our disappointment, guilt, and grieving, seeking new paths, and sure to find. Christ is alive and goes before us to show and share what love can do. This is a day of new beginnings; our God is making all things new.

As we prepare to turn the page on the calendar to a whole new year, I confidently claim these words of faithful anticipation. 2024 was a challenging year for my family. Maybe you've experienced some setbacks and challenges too. Yet, a new year of possibility stretches before us and God's mercies are new every morning. This is a day of new beginnings; our God is making all things new.

Perhaps you can begin the new year with a breath prayer: Take several deep, slow, healing breaths. With each exhale, let go of whatever pain or disappointment you may have experienced in the past year. With each inhale, invite the Holy Spirit to fill you with wisdom and direction for the new year. You might even use the words of the hymn above to help you stay focused during this prayer. On the inhale you might say or think "This is a day of new beginnings" and on the exhale you might say or think "our God is making all things new."

Another prayer I love to use at the beginning of each new year is John Wesley's "Covenant Prayer". John Wesley began the Methodist movement and encouraged Methodists to pray this prayer at the beginning of each new year as a way to remember and reaffirm the vows made at our baptisms: "I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by

I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

Indeed, let us freely and heartily give ourselves to God in the year ahead! I look forward to following Christ's lead in showing and sharing what love can do in us and in our community in the coming months. Financial Footnotes

Happy New Year! Hard to believe that 2024 is behind us already. I am sure everyone has a different opinion on how the year actually went for them. As far as the church finances went, we were certainly blessed by the gifts we received from all of you. As I am writing this article the numbers are still being tallied but the preliminary figures look good.

First of all, we were able to pay our 2024 apportionments totaling \$43,188 in full. Next year we will see a slight increase for a total of \$44,544. We will continue to take 15% of our weekly general offering along with any funds designated for apportionment giving to meet this obligation.

Because of your gifts we were able to distribute \$11,000 + to special giving. The organizations that we supported were UM Children's Services, International Disaster Relief-Ukraine, Ludhiana Christian Medical College & Hospital, McCurdy Ministries Community Center, Heifer Project International, Bolivia church project for purchase of sewing machines, missionary Nkemba Ndjungu, Stepping Stones, Grace Bridge Korean church and Monday's Meal.

Your gifts also were used to fund the various activities in our own church. We sponsored Corn fest, Touch a Truck and Trunk or Treat. Messy Church has met the past two months with a whole new mind set of what church can look like! Messy church meets the second Sunday of the month, if you have not been here consider checking it out. Various classes are offered for adult study and grief share. Monday's meal will find volunteers weekly in the church kitchen preparing the 200 + meals each week.

Our 45-year young church building is a continual project keeping up with improvements and repairs. The obvious improvements of course are the new carpeting and painting, but many things just must be done. We are currently looking at different lighting in some of the classrooms in the education wing. New door handles were recently installed to make them more accessible for everyone.
